

MANAL Financial

Overview

- Mosque (Masjid Al Noor) at 430 Logy Bay Road which was built in 1990 at a total cost of \$500,000 and heavily renovated during 2010 to 2015. Current market value is \$1 million
- Purchased 5 acres of land at a cost of \$165,000 on Sugar Loaf Road (about 1 km away from the present Mosque) for future community needs. Current market value of this property is about \$500,000.
- Developed a new cemetery (2.5 acres) on Bauline Line in Torbay at a total cost of \$300,000. Five acres of land was acquired from the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador at no cost to MANAL
- Work in progress to build an Islamic Centre on Bauline Line at an estimated cost of \$1 million to meet the religious, social and other needs of the community
- Planning in progress to acquire additional 5 acres land grant adjacent to Bauline Line property from the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador
- MANAL operates three accounts all with CIBC
- Operational account has a current balance of \$275,000. This account is to meet day to day operational needs of MANAL. Donation by members and funds from the Mosque donation box are the primary sources of income
- Mosque expansion account has a current balance of \$50,000. This account was created to cover the cost of major infrastructure projects such as Islamic centre. Mosque donation box is the primary source of revenue
- Mosque investment account has a current balance of \$275,000. This account
 was created in 1993 to meet the emergency need of the Mosque if membership
 declines to a level which can't sustain the annual operation and maintenance
 cost of the Mosque
- Since 2001 MANAL has received \$125,000 from the Revenue Canada as HST rebate
- Important MANAL documents are stored in a locker with CIBC bank
- PayPal online donation system was setup
- MANAL files income tax annually and maintains good standing with Revenue Canada

| Mosque Renovation and Capacity Expansion | Online donation system is being setup in the main prayer hall area Work in progress to diversify investment account growth Work in progress to launch fund raising drive for the Islamic Centre Shingles were replaced in 2010 at a cost of \$20,000 Mosque was renovated at a cost of \$325,000 to create a separate prayer area for Sisters and to expand the praying capacity of the Mosque from 100 worshippers to 500 including the renovation of the kitchen and addition of a new Wudu making facility on the main floor gents washroom Mosque old carpet was replaced at a cost of \$30,000 with a new wall to wall carpet for Brothers and Sisters praying areas A chandelier was purchased and installed in the main prayer hall at a cost of \$5,000. Mosque lighting system was also upgraded. Mosque dome was renovated at a cost of \$25,000. Mosque entrance doors, windows and sidings were replaced at a total cost of \$65,000 Mosque audio system was upgraded at a cost of \$12,000 Digital monitor for prayer schedule was setup Geothermal based central heating and cooling system was installed at a cost of \$98,000 Mosque Minaret was repaired at a cost of \$12,000 Planning in progress to expand Imam's area in the main prayer hall |
